John 10:27

[27] My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me.

Ouestion 3a

Psalm 19:1-6;

For the director of music. A psalm of David.

- [19:1] The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands.
- [2] Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge.
- [3] They have no speech, they use no words; no sound is heard from them.
- [4] Yet their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world.

In the heavens God has pitched a tent for the sun. [5] It is like a bridegroom coming out of his chamber, like a champion rejoicing to run his course.

[6] It rises at one end of the heavens

and makes its circuit to the other; nothing is deprived of its warmth.

Romans 1:18-20;

God's Wrath Against Sinful Humanity

[18] The wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of people, who suppress the truth by their wickedness, [19] since what may be known about God is plain to them, because God has made it plain to them. [20] For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse.

Psalm 119:105; [105] Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.

John 17:17; [17] Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth.

Amos 3:7; [7] Surely the Sovereign LORD does nothing without revealing his plan to his servants the prophets.

2 Peter 1:20-21; [20] Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation of things. [21] For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

Hebrews 1:1-2;

God's Final Word: His Son

[Heb 1:1] In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, [2] but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe.

Isaiah 30:21; [21] Whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear a voice behind you, saying, "This is the way; walk in it."

John 14:26; [26] But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.

Read <u>Isaiah 65:1-2</u> and <u>Ezekiel</u> 20:4-7

<u>Isaiah 65:1-2</u>

Judgment and Salvation

[65:1] "I revealed myself to those who did not ask for me; I was found by those who did not seek me.

To a nation that did not call on my name, I said, 'Here am I, here am I.'

[2] All day long I have held out my hands to an obstinate people, who walk in ways not good, pursuing their own imaginations—

Ezekiel 20:4-7

[4] "Will you judge them? Will you judge them, son of man? Then confront them with the detestable practices of their ancestors [5] and say to them: 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: On the day I chose Israel, I swore with uplifted hand to the descendants of Jacob and revealed myself to them in Egypt. With uplifted hand I said to them, "I am the LORD your God." [6] On that day I swore to them that I would bring them out of Egypt into a land I had searched out for them, a land flowing with milk and honey, the most beautiful of all lands. [7] And I said to them, "Each of you, get rid of the vile images you have set your eyes on, and do not defile yourselves with the idols of Egypt. I am the LORD your God."

Question 5a

Exodus 19:3-8; [3] Then Moses went up to God, and the LORD called to him from the mountain and said, "This is what you are to say to the

descendants of Jacob and what you are to tell the people of Israel: [4] 'You yourselves have seen what I did to Egypt, and how I carried you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. [5] Now if you obey me fully and keep my covenant, then out of all nations you will be my treasured possession. Although the whole earth is mine, [6] you will be for me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.' These are the words you are to speak to the Israelites."

[7] So Moses went back and summoned the elders of the people and set before them all the words the LORD had commanded him to speak. [8] The people all responded together, "We will do everything the LORD has said." So Moses brought their answer back to the LORD.

Jeremiah 30:22; [22] "'So you will be my people, and I will be your God.'"

Ezekiel 20:19-20; [19] I am the LORD your God; follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws. [20] Keep my Sabbaths holy, that they may be a sign between us. Then you will know that I am the LORD your God."

Question 6a

Deuteronomy 30:15-18;

[15] See, I set before you today life and prosperity, death and destruction. [16] For I command you today to love the LORD your God, to walk in obedience to him, and to keep his commands, decrees and laws; then you will live and increase, and the LORD your God will bless you in the land you are entering to possess.

[17] But if your heart turns away and you are not obedient, and if you are drawn away to bow down to other gods and worship them, [18] I declare to you this day that you will certainly be destroyed. You will not live long in the land you are crossing the Jordan to enter and possess.

2 Kings 17:6; [6] In the ninth year of Hoshea, the king of Assyria captured Samaria and deported the Israelites to Assyria. He settled them in Halah, in Gozan on the Habor River and in the towns of the Medes.

Question 9a

2 Kings 24:2; [2] The LORD sent Babylonian, Aramean, Moabite and Ammonite raiders against him to destroy Judah, in accordance with the word of the LORD proclaimed by his servants the prophets.

2 Chronicles 36:15;

The Fall of Jerusalem

[15] The LORD, the God of their ancestors, sent word to them through his messengers again and again, because he had pity on his people and on his dwelling place.

Question 7a

Psalm 86:11; [11] Teach me your way, LORD, that I may rely on your faithfulness; give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name.

Ezekiel 11:19-20; [19] I will give them an undivided heart and put a new spirit in them; I will remove from them their heart of stone and give them a heart of flesh. [20] Then they will follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws. They will be my people, and I will be their God.

FOURTH DAY

Read Chronicles 7:14

[14] if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land.

Isaiah 6:1-10;

Isaiah's Commission

[6:1] In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. [2] Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. [3] And they were calling to one another:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory."

- [4] At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.
- [5] "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty."
- [6] Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. [7] With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for."
- [8] Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?"

And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

- [9] He said, "Go and tell this people:
- "Be ever hearing, but never understanding; be ever seeing, but never perceiving."
- [10] Make the heart of this people calloused; make their ears dull and close their eyes.

Otherwise they might see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their hearts,

and turn and be healed."

Question 9b

Jeremiah 1:1-10; [Je 1:1] The words of Jeremiah son of Hilkiah, one of the priests at Anathoth in the territory of Benjamin. [2] The word of the LORD came to him in the thirteenth year of the reign of Josiah son of Amon king of Judah, [3] and through the reign of Jehoiakim son of Josiah king of Judah, down to the fifth month of the eleventh year of Zedekiah son of Josiah king of Judah, when the people of Jerusalem went into exile.

The Call of Jeremiah

- [4] The word of the LORD came to me, saying,
- [5] "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."
- [6] "Alas, Sovereign LORD," I said, "I do not know how to speak; I am too young."
- [7] But the LORD said to me, "Do not say, 'I am too young.' You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. [8] Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the LORD.
- [9] Then the LORD reached out his hand and touched my mouth and said to me, "I have put my words in your mouth. [10] See, today I appoint you over nations and kingdoms to uproot and tear down, to destroy and overthrow, to build and to plant."

Question 10

1 Peter 1:10-12; [10] Concerning this salvation, the prophets, who spoke of the grace that was to come to you, searched intently and with the greatest care, [11] trying to find out the time and circumstances to which the Spirit of Christ in them was pointing when he predicted the sufferings of the Messiah and the glories that would follow. [12] It was revealed to them that they were not serving themselves but you, when they spoke of the things that have now been told you by those who have preached the gospel to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven. Even angels long to look into these things.

Read Romans 15:4

Romans 15:4

[4] For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope.

Review Isaiah 65:2
